## DRESS CODE

*As per By law 2 - Current as at 1st January 2026*

Members are reminded of their agreed commitment to respect the traditions of The Moreton Club with regard to Dress Code which set and maintain the tone and standards of The Club. Members and guests are required and expected to be appropriately attired at all times within The Club, in keeping with The Club standards.

Members bringing guests to The Moreton Club are responsible to advise their guests of The Moreton Club's Dress Code and ensure their guests adhere to the Code while visiting The Club.

Appropriate dress to suit the elegant surrounds includes:

### DAY TIME EVENTS

Smart day wear: this may include dresses, suits, skirts, tailored pants/trousers and blouses/shirts, jackets, court shoes, dressy sandals, boots.

### EVENING EVENTS

As above however usually the evenings will be more formal than the day wear.

Gentlemen coming to The Club are expected to dress in a way that corresponds to the ladies' wear, and gentlemen are required to wear a jacket and tie at all times within The Club unless otherwise stated.

### EXCEPTIONS TO THE ABOVE DRESS CODE

"Thursday Roast Night" ( and/or other events during the year as advised ) are less formal with regard to Dress Code. Members and guests are still expected to wear smart dress at those times however gentlemen are not required to wear a jacket or tie.

Other exceptions to the above Dress Code when members and guests can wear more relaxed dress include:

- Members collecting or ordering Take Away or anything else from Reception
- Members of the Flower Roster at The Club to arrange flowers
- Members or guests staying in-house when coming and going to and from the Accommodation
- Members having breakfast before 9am
- Members dropping off or picking up other Members at The Club
- Members or guests who need to vary the dress code for medical reasons
- Members attending The Club for a Committee or Sub-Committee meeting
- Members and guests at private functions with prior permission by the General Manager and/or President

Inappropriate dress includes shorts, T-Shirts, jeans, jean style pants, denim of all types, sportswear or active wear of any type, sports shoes, sneakers or walking loafers, Birkenstocks, flip flop style footwear. Members are reminded that if a person does arrive inappropriately dressed the matter will be handled discreetly by the President or General Manager.

For children aged 12 and over, school uniform or smart day wear is acceptable.

Please note that National dress or Military uniform is allowed at any time.
